1. Development Proposal: Cheekeye River Developments

Guests:

- Caroline Lamont, representing 3 partners for development application (Matthews southwest, Bethel, and Squamish Nation: Cheekeye River Developments
- Tamsin Mills, Planner, District of Squamish

Presentation and discussion notes:

- The proposed development would requires OCP amendment and zoning to proceed. The application proposes 750 single family homes with modest commercial development.
- Public information was held in October. The applicant is planning to introduce the project at Council on Feb 3rd. Probably another public information meeting coming up in February. Welcome all comments from Trails Society, to Tamsin by email or planning@squamish.ca.
- Tamsin and Caroline shared some slides and maps. Info is available online through the District's <u>development showcase</u>



Key Trails info and discussion:

- <u>Intergovernmental accord</u> between District of Squamish and Squamish Nation states that the Brackendale Farmers Institute Park has to remain where it is (51 acres)
- Trails to be inventoried and remain or be located
- Tamsin and Caroline's presentation references the Squamish Trails Master Plan
- Phased development, and the District would have the ability to require the developer to do trail improvements early in the development.
- Ray Peters trail (RPT) extension and improvement is proposed. Surfacing of the RPT is a question – gravel or paved?
- For relocated trails, what would be the standard of these trails... tbd.
- Need cut-through trails within the neighbourhood to be well designed
- Suggestion that the District ought to talk to CN about trail connectivity in the context area of Brackendale? Whatever the discussion and treatment is in this development area, provides good precedent and model for other areas as well.

- STS would also like to take a broader view of the trail connections from the proposed neighbourhood to the other trails and amenities; i.e. need to get to the highway overpass, and safe routes to school.
- Also need to pay attention to the trail connections through the neighbourhood and out to the powerlines ... popular for dog walking etc.
- What will be the fencing along the powerline ... interface for the trail users etc.
- Need to provide trail connection in and out of the neighbourhood, so that people can get to the commercial area. Currently the ped/bike facility along Government road is a shoulder that should be improved for active transportation.
- The roads within the development will be narrow (with adequate parking areas for residents designed in)

- Question posed by STS about the District's policy around replacement of 'like' / similar trails
 no net loss ... how is this being approached for this development proposal?
- Wayfinding: need trail wayfinding to be considered through the planning and building process
- For the debris flow mitigation project, it was disussed that STS should keep asking the question about including trail connection so that it can be designed in to this project if possible.

Ideas for trails projects



-At a future meeting we should total up what all of the annual expenses are to get an understanding of what our annual 'carrying costs' are to keep STS running.




Meg update on the Turtle Trail

Meeting come to order: 19:11

Guests: Katie Homes – Hospital Hill Play Park

Hospital Hill Park Update: Thanks to STS for acting as a fundraising partner and coordination. Have a draft plan (previously sent by email). Goal is to create a play park that is simple and respectful of the existing landscape. A park for the area is in DoS plans but has been limited by available funding. Would need to deal with drainage issues to start. Would use boulders, logs to create play features. Swings and slides to be funded by others. Majority of costs are machine time and community labour. Smoke Bluff Park to donate \$5000 and \$2000 so far from neighbourhood canvassing with goal of \$5000. With that \$10,000 in hand hoping to approach DoS for a further \$15,000 to reach the \$25,000 budget. Financial: Donations of over \$20 can receive income tax receipts from the Squamish Trails Society Hospital Hill Play Park Project. News of project to be provided for Trails Society web site.

Motion: that "TS accept and dedicate specified charitable donations to trail design, site clearing and drainage facilitation for the Hospital Hill Play Park and that no general funds from STS will be used for this project" Moved by Shawn, seconded by Stephane - carried

"Westbuild File"

Membership report - Heather

Nothing new to report, but given that AGM is coming up it would be timely to have another newsletter. BBB "applications", membership renewal, AGM notice etc.

Feb 3 Meeting with Bob Smith, Scott Lamont DoS:

Great meeting, very receptive, would like to meet twice per year. Curious what was high on our list. Their story – no money, though they are hoping to get new machine that could be used for trail maintenance. Only specifically budgeted maintenance items is Corridor and Discovery Trails. Reiterated how much they appreciate the BBB. Another item was discussion of how inappropriate basalt gravels are. News to them! We need to continue to facilitate these types of meetings.



Agreed that we need improvements regarding signage and wouldn't it be nice if STS was involved in the discussion.

NEW BUSINESS

Meryl Park: (behind Catholic Church) Access from Greenwood Way is going to be gone with construction of house. There is another access at Greenwood that needs some work. Highlights the need to protect access points.

Kingswood Overpass Connector: Appears to be loss of connector to Dryden and trail along tracks.

Leads to discussion regarding crossing of CN Rail right of way. Need a coordinated strategy, which

would start with an effort to identify where the problems are. Defer to next meeting.

Be Bright at Night: Would the STS support asking DoS to trademark the slogan?

Needs a champion. Maybe ICBC would be interested?

Option to approach District / ICBC on letterhead? Maybe if DoS knew brand was being offered to ICBC they might pony up to trademark themselves? Important that the concept remain locally owned – yet still available for all users.

Safeguarding Path from Greenwood Way to Thunderbird Creek: Unprotected 12 foot drop (as previously discussed) Discussed with DoS and reply that this is on private land. Action item might be that these types of concerns are attached to priority list given to DoS. May be timely that we produce an up to date "concern" list. Possible approach to produce a "form letter" that is forwarded to DoS when concerns are brought forward. Doug to resend correspondence from last year to executive.

Turtle Trail Signage: Went to Council standing committee and had quite warm response. Will be looking at pinch points. Liked the idea of temporary markers. Possibility of posters around community to garner support and feedback. 100 pieces for \$200. Moved by Stéphane, seconded by Heather that we authorize this expense – carried. Started Council presentation with the branding discussion and wayfinding. Will be part of discussion when it comes to design of interpretive signs.



Mike Weeks Trail: Work party Friday April 17. Gravelling trail around Highlands Elementary. School Board to donate trucking. Ramp to be built with lock-blocks, donated by SD48. STS to provide gravel from our credit at Coast Agg. Moved by John that we apply up to \$1000 of this credit for this project, seconded by Stéphane – carried.

AGM: Coming up in April. Need to solicit members for executive. Would we like to have a guest speaker – pulls in more people? Need to advertise. Start thinking about it!

Meeting come to order: 19:05

Guests: SDBA - Corry / SORCA - Jeff and Roland



Background: Funds (historically \$60,000) from DoS. SORCA has been doing the majority of the legwork. Jeff made presentation to Committee of the Whole during the budget process and requested \$60,000 again this year. Discussion: how do we spend this funds with about %15 going "to the Trail Society". Six workers for about 12 weeks split into different projects. Last year worked in Coho area. Planning started late last year so would like to establish priorities earlier. Like to see the biggest impact for all users. How did they come up with number? Broke down into a week based on the number of members in each group. Based on a work week. 3 for SORCA, 1 for Trails, 1 for SDBA. Over the course of the season this would balance out. Original agreement (this is 4th year) was hashed out between Ed, Bob and Cliff. Multi-user trails or cross-over / overlap areas the biggest bang for "everybody". This year looking at Trestle Trail. Also looking at Bracken Trail because of potential trail user conflicts – possibly twin. One uphill walker and the other biker downhill. SORCA looking at dialing in climbing trails – lots of shared use. STS ideas Trestle to Pia, Mike Weeks trail for gravel placement, Smokebluffs Funarama. SDBA biggest focus is "organizing the hillbillies." Glad to be a part of trail organizations. Reality is that motorized users are not well organized. Message is that they have to go above and beyond because of some real bad examples. Some stuff does not work. Cannot have motorbikes and bikes climbing the same routes. We are not separate user groups. Motorized users have got bikes too and are "eventually going to have to walk (on trails) with their girl friends". We all need to be on the same team as locals need to ensure education, stewardship and responsible trail use through education / signage. This is a lower Mainland issue as there is no "dirt bike" trails in the North Shore. Need areas for family, kids, learning and training areas for motorized users. Only ten locals maintaining trails and (many) guys from the city destroying them every weekend. We need somewhere that riders can do the "skateboard" type of activities. If you do not have a designated "redneck" park they will spread into other areas. "GAS"



(Cat Lake) area is ideal but cannot get Section 57. Is there another area in the Mamquam Forest Service Road area. Something needs to happen moving forward.

"Why are we having crossover issues close to town when motorized users can get farther out where there are not the same kind of user conflicts."

We do have good relationship with Forestry and have been good allies.

STS Issues: Funding is a problem. Signage, safety gaps. STS looking at bigger projects for connectivity, bike lane infrastructure.









Past issues: Liability problems for private land owners that contain trails ie. Tom Dowad lands. SORCA is working through a new insurance policy for trail use on private land, as DoS does not want to take on liability. SORCA's insurance intended to protect SORCA from liability as well. Been on SORCA agenda for years and on DoS since Trails Master Plan.

Altercation with mountain biker on Mashiter Trail. SORCA would like to educate users — both cyclists and walkers to find a way to co-exist. Some trails need to designated as non-walker ie. Roller Coaster, Half Nelson are crazy to walk on. Mashiter should be designated as multi-user trails with proper protocols — this is a road, not a trail. Eg. Downhill cyclist keep to the right. Discussion: We need a consistent signage standard and policy. Need to have an inclusive consultation with DoS. Develop a consistent standard — greater use of QR codes. DoS is putting forward RFP for District wide way-finding. All groups must use same base standard. All should be registered on Tourism Squamish.

Trail signage standards next evolution of "branding process". Why are they all brown logo with green paint" – should be trail markers with bright reflective strip on top so you can see them – day or night.

Would like a yearly funding review but would also like a 5 commitment of \$60,000 per so that planning can start early to ensure works start as early as possible in season. Workers need to be interviewed and hired prior to start of works. For this year, as funding has not been approved, nothing has started yet. Optimistic that funding will be approved, but until cash still will be waiting to move forward. Lots of overlapping issues, so lets keep each other informed of issues so that we can assist each other. Perhaps we could exchange minutes. **End of guest presentation:**




Trail Adoption: Jim: Why don't we have more trail adoption. Use to have it and it was not very successful. Is part of the Trails Master Plan. Lot of liability issues and waivers. Without a dedicated Trail Coordinator it fell by the wayside. Worthwhile to do some further investigation to see how it works in other areas. Maybe simplify so that it is very basic. Raking – sticks and rocks, garbage and dog poo might get a larger contribution. Real trail inventory might be useful in this regard. GIS system is suited for this. Jim researching some m ore.



AGM: Coming up in April 16 at Arts Council Building. Need to solicit members for executive. Would we like to have a guest speaker – pulls in more people? Advertising in process. Meg to discuss the Turtle Trail. Membership drive! Moved by Stéphane, seconded by John that we invite Meg to discuss the Turtle Trail – carried.

Topics for discussion. Trail visioning / setting priorities. Use large trail doc. Heather to make sticky notes of existing ideas which can be added to. Start the process so that membership knows what it takes to make these things happen. Maybe we can find a champion for a particular project, or get more folks to sign up for Brush Back or ?

Emailing Agendas: Stéphane moved, seconded by Patrick that we forward meeting agendas each month to membership. Discussion: proposed that we include a notice on next newsletter that we will be sending a monthly notice of meeting with agenda to all members – with an option to opt out of receiving such notifications.

Looking for involvement as part of the wind festival. Maybe wind art along some of our trail loops as features. Trail maps, brochures, business cards need to be available for these types of events (may need updating). Should have display at Adventure Centre.

Greenwood Way to Jay Crescent / Be Bright at Night: Moved by Doug, seconded by Meg suggesting that the existing letters from Doug directed to Council be re-written coming from the Trails Society. Would anybody like to take these on as projects? Highlights the risk of these type of rock ballast structures that need a design solution to alleviate those risks, and trademark "Be Bright at Night". Jim to take out his thesaurus.



Meeting come to order: 19:05

Special Presentation: Turtle Trail Presentation - Different and Shorter

Acknowledging the diversity of people living in Squamish and the wide spread of individuals living throughout our corridor. One of the intensions of the Turtle Trail is to connect this diversity. Layout is roughly in the same of a Turtle with waterfront as the head – legs to Estuary, River, Smoke Bluffs and Mamquam. Core trail approx. 12 km and is largely in place. Squamish "residents" originally hunter gatherers, followed by farmers. Then came transportation and logging. After the Second World War truck logging was the driver. Since that time there has been a great diversification. The intension of the Turtle Trail is to share these stories.



There has been several presentations to community and Council. DoS engineering to do preliminary route to review to identify problems. Will be part of community way finding (maps, brochures, aps) and interpretive signage. Funding waiting for communication piece (as a follow up from Municipal branding excersise). Once that is done there will be a business plan for funding.

Role of Trail Society. Has been involved in the initial trail markers (turtle icons). Next meeting with youth (graffiti art?) and working with Wind Society to develop art projects.





* Rose Park is ready but has been put off with sea dike planning and alignment through proposed Forestry Centre.

Active Transportation Plan / Turtle Trail / Corridor Trail extention to Chief - funding available but you need to have a plan to get funding. What are the deliverables? What is attainable? Must work hard to solve constraint problems before plans are put in place. Have to really sell it,

must have a good planning, must have a total, complete

plan.





Bridge repair required on two of bridges on Nature Trail as well.



Moved by Stéphane, seconded by Heather that we accept the financial statements as presented – carried.



Meeting came to order: 19:02



Guest: Jim Harvey – Proposed Debeck Hill / Bracken Trail / Wonderland Trail to Tantalus Road Connector off the east end of Depot to easement to DoS land, from there to Tantalus Road cul-desac on Crown Land. Biggest issue is crossings of creek at the end of Depot. There is a neighbour /advocate who is canvassing neighbours. Jim would look after Section 57 application to the Crown, SORCA is willing to take on maintenance. Proposal would be to make it a walking, running, biking connector. Construction itself "not a big challenge" but help would be required for bridges and endorsements. Will need to go to DoS for approvals and for presentation for DFO support. \$8000 budget. Discussion: who's project? STS or SORCA or? Suggested that this would be a good fit for STS with DoS carrying Corridor Trail - SORCA being the "mountain trail" people and STS looking lowland trails. This IS an important connector and worthy of whatever support STS can offer. Moved by Shawn, seconded by Jen that we send a letter to DoS in support of connector between Depot east and Tantalus Road. Carried. Discussion re: funding – would this be something which we might have dedicated fund raising / contributions ie. approach SORCA for a bridge (that may or may not be lying about)? Jim has offered to do the leg work. Noted that one house is probably

encroaching onto proposed trail – suggested that DoS provide some leadership on this kind of issue. Nice if DoS had a communication package explaining the implication of trails or trail right of way along private property. This type of preemptive communication would alleviate challenges of working alongside private parcels. There are many other easements in Squamish and we should not have to deal with issue on a case by case basis.


As an aside, SORCA vision to make Bracken Trial climbing trail.

Phil Scott – Director of Development Holborn Development (includes land from Pia to Thunderbird Creek) Previous issues involved Doug Day project and proposed bridge across Meighn Creek. Envisioning road up to Pia from Newport Ridge. Noted that future development will impact Trestle Trail, Eightball, Coho Park Trail etc. Holborn not "interested" in taking on the burden of trail maintenance but there are trails that are easy to "keep" ie. Covenant Trail, Cherub, Seven Up. Clarification: new proposal is north of existing waterline and groundwater source of Meighn.

Jay Crescent: "Switchback Trail" from Greenwood Crescent to Jay Crescent

Originally a Townline development. Holborn may be able to provide funding for safety upgrades AND may be willing to provide DoS easement or transfer of liability through arrangement with Muni real estate department. DoS willing to let STS be the lead to do works.

University Heights: Proposed smaller lot / multifamily subdivision and impacts on trails through area. Noted important connector from Carpenter's Son bridge. Presentation of proposed trails and connectors throughout the site: Suggested that developer provide us with an updated plan so that we can provide comments and coordinated review with SORCA? Discussion of role of STS "between" developer and DoS. Role of developer – bringing plans to STS and looking for input / proposals.



Approval of Agenda: Moved by Matt, seconded by Jim

Approval of October minutes: Moved by Jen, seconded by Matt we approve – carried

REPORTS:

Smoke Bluff: Prioritized and long term vision for Park – parking lot expansion to avoid parking in neighbourhoods – which has been a long standing issue. Play Park has been a huge success – even in our fall monsoons.

Brushback Brigade report: - Vic; Brushback has done 200 hours and 6.5 kilometers of trails so far this year. Been working on Ray Peter where it parallels the highway. May run out of gas before they run out of daylight. Looking forward to their year end get together. Suggested by Jen we buy them lunch.

Jennifer Changes to the Charitable Societies Act: requirements. Jen has found the original

constitution. We will need to resubmit it and bylaws (schedule b) — trying to update to include new technology (they want everything electronic) and lots of stuff - like we need to change how Society might dissolve. Also need to clarify voting, nonvoting, executive, etc. Discussion regarding bylaws ie. three week waiting period to become a member, with approval of Executive, so avoid stacked meetings etc. Needs to be brought back for future discussion. Jen will put together a presentation. New process starts in June and then Societies will have two years to put together new Constitution and bylaw packages. New Schedule A will be a standard set of bylaws that can be adapted. To be circulated.

Kowtain Trail: Resident in area asked about possiblility of upgrade to existing trail. There is a lot of history and discussion BUT this is SFN land and anything must have their approval. Suggested that STS facilitate an introduction of proposal to SFN, DFO, SRWS, Streamkeepers, SES. Carl to provide proposed signage



OCP Input: Stakeholder engagement through telephone interviews, after which they will develop a broader community engagement process. OCP must enshrine trails at the start of the process – not an afterthought. John to approach to provide STS mandate and vision.

DoS / Bob Smith: Appealing to Council for funding for dedicated trail maintenance personnel. Previous budget discussions had also included equipment costs.

Active Transportation Plan: recently attended by Meg – wide representation. There is an online survey that is important to fill out. Included in plan engineering, enforcement, evaluation, education and encouragement (not in that order). Public meeting coming up November 28. Discussion: "Share the roads" "Idaho stop"


Senior Wellness Fair: Map makes them stop. Got a couple memberships - "it was good".
